The Standing Committee on Ornithological Nomenclature of the International Ornithological Committee has prepared a list of established names of avian family-group taxa (superfamilies to tribes) and their synonyms as the first step in process of writing an application to the International Commission on Zoological Nomenclature to stabilize usage of these names. The SCON wishes to obtain input from all interested ornithologists on this list and its proposed application to the ICZN. The list is available to all interested ornithologists who are willing to examine it carefully and provide the SCON with corrections, additions, comments and suggestions.
