Wheatears in Winter Quarters

Reference has been made in a previous issue to a male Black-Eared Wheatear Oenanthe hispanica which returned to Kano the following winter and used the same territory.

This bird was first seen in January 1964 and was present daily until March 3rd 1964. It reappeared in November 1964 and I ringed it on December 11th. It was present whenever I visited the Agricultural farm until February 17 th 1965. In the autumn of 1965 it reappeared and was present until February 20th 1966 when it disappeared and has not been seen or recaught since.

In the winter of I964/65 its main perching post was a plough in the agricultural implement park. In the summer of I965 the park was rearranged. In the winter of I965/66 the Wheatear's main perching post was a trailer about 70 yards distant from the previous perching post. The bird was only recaught once but the ring on its leg could be clearly seen.

Wheatears are very common round Kano but this was the only Black-Eared Wheatear I have seen within a radius of 50 miles of Kano. Presumably the same bird returned in the winter of I967 and used the same tree as its base.

It appears that the territorial instinct in Wheatears in their winter-quarters is very strong .
