### ADDITIONS TO LOCAL AVIFAUNAS PLATEAU CHECK-LIST.

The following have so far not been recorded, though they must have been seen:

- 1. Green Fruit Pigeon: Vinago australis.

  The cat caught one in our garden at Vom Hospital,
  on August 5th 1964.
- 2. West African Prinia: Prinia subflava.
  A total of 5 have been netted in my garden recently -

20.9.67 one.

21.10.67 one:wing 50mm. Tail 51mm

28.10.67 one:wing 53mm. Tail 49mm.

(This was inactive moult, involving the inner 4 prinaries; contral pair of tail feathers; lesser and median coverts, and the head and neck feathers).

12. 1.68 two: wing 53mm. Tail 62mm.

wing 50mm. Tail 53mm.

3. Short Wing Grass Warbler: Cisticola brachyptera.
One was netted on 18. 1. 68 in the yellow wagtail roost,
Kuru Forestry Reserve, near Vom. The wing flight
feathers were in active moult.

A second specimen was netted and ringed in the same swamp on 18th February, 1968; this was not showing any evidence of moult.

4. Corsican Woodchat: Lanius Senator badius.

While the European Woodchat is common on the Plateau,

I had never seen a Corsican one until January 10th 1968;

it appeared in our garden from time to time until it

was netted on 2.2.68 and the identification confirmed

beyond reasonable doubt.
